Recognizing the profound impact of vision impairment on individuals' daily lives, our foundation has conducted numerous eye camps, screening over 43,000 patients nationwide. These camps, facilitated by professional ophthalmologists and supported by marquee partners including Hindustan Charity Trust, HCL, PB Fintech, Manikchand, JSL Jajpur, and ICICI Lombard's CSR initiative "Caring Hands," have played a crucial role in addressing the unmet eye care needs of marginalized populations.

By implementing this comprehensive eye care initiative, we aim to contribute to the promotion of health and well-being for individuals of all ages, particularly those from marginalized communities. Through collaborative efforts and strategic partnerships, we aspire to create a future where every individual has access to quality eye care services, enabling them to lead fulfilling and productive lives.



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Our foundation, in collaboration with ICICI Lombard, is committed to addressing the healthcare disparities faced by rural populations by enhancing existing medical facilities and infrastructure in Primary Health Care Centers (PHCs) across select districts in India.

The Healthy Villages initiative seeks to address the fundamental health challenges faced by rural communities, including limited access to quality healthcare services, inadequate infrastructure, and poor sanitation facilities. Through a pilot project conducted in collaboration with ICICI Lombard, we have identified key areas for intervention and implemented targeted measures to improve the overall health and well-being of villagers in the districts of Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, and Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh. Enhancement of infrastructure has been done by investing in upgrading the physical infrastructure of PHCs to ensure a conducive

environment for healthcare delivery. The enhancement also included improving the quality of healthcare services, by providing essential medical equipment, hospital furniture, and storage solutions such as racks and shelves to store medicines and medical supplies effectively. As part of our efforts to improve access to healthcare services, we have established fully equipped medical kiosks within PHCs. These kiosks serve as satellite clinics where villagers can receive basic medical consultations and treatments closer to their homes.

Our approach to establishing Healthy Villages is rooted in evidence-based practices and academic research in the fields of public health, healthcare management, and community development. By leveraging a collaborative and interdisciplinary approach, we aim to create sustainable models of healthcare delivery that prioritize the needs and preferences of rural communities.



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Our foundation is committed to addressing the menstrual hygiene needs of women and girls in underserved communities across India. Through our comprehensive menstrual hygiene management program, we aim to raise awareness, provide access to menstrual hygiene products, and empower women to manage their menstrual health with dignity and confidence.

The lack of access to adequate menstrual hygiene products and information poses significant health risks and social challenges for women and girls, particularly in low-income and marginalized communities. Recognizing the importance of addressing this issue, our foundation has initiated a series of awareness programs focused on menstrual hygiene education and access to menstrual hygiene products. These programs have been implemented in diverse settings, including Coolie Camp in

New Delhi, Millgate in Hisar, and Ajmer, with the aim of reaching women and girls in underserved areas. With this project we were able to provide Conduct educational workshops and awareness sessions to dispel myths and misconceptions surrounding menstruation. Distribution of biodegradable sanitary napkins and other menstrual hygiene products to women and girls in underserved communities was also carried out.

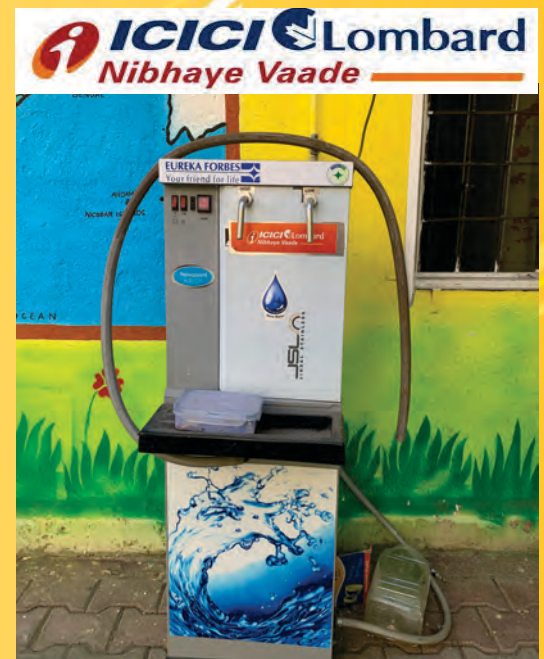

Access to safe drinking water is fundamental to ensuring the health and well-being of individuals, particularly children, in educational settings. In alignment with UN Goals 3 and 6, our partnership with ICICI Lombard GIC Ltd has facilitated the implementation of Project NIRANJALI, aimed at providing safe drinking water to students in over 700 educational institutions benefiting 600,000 children across India. Through the installation of water purifiers and comprehensive water quality testing initiatives, we seek to promote health, hygiene, and sustainable water management practices within school environments.

Recognizing the critical importance of addressing this issue, our partnership with ICICI Lombard GIC Ltd has focused on implementing Project NIRANJALI, which aims to improve access to safe drinking water for school

children. Through the installation of water purification systems and rigorous water quality testing measures, we strive to create healthier and more hygienic learning environments for students. We also collaborated with reputable water purification companies, such as Eureka Forbes and Kent, to install high-quality water purification systems in educational institutions.

The aim is to create safer, healthier, and more sustainable learning environments for students in educational institutions across India. Through strategic partnerships, rigorous water quality testing, and comprehensive capacity-building initiatives, we seek to empower schools and communities to prioritize safe drinking water practices and foster a culture of health and hygiene among students.



Strengthening Ambulance Services (CSR initiative of AGS Health)



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Prabhaav Foundation, with the support of AGS Health, has undertaken a CSR initiative to strengthen ambulance services in rural areas of Rajasthan, specifically targeting Sawai Man Singh Hospital in Jaipur. The aim is to ensure well-equipped and efficiently managed ambulances capable of providing timely and safe transportation of patients, thus enhancing access to emergency medical care in underserved communities.

To bolster the capabilities of ambulance services, Prabhaav Foundation and AGS Health have provided support to five ambulances by donating essential medical equipment. Oxygen Concentrators (10 Liters Each), Jump Bags, Bag Valve Mask (BVM), Suction Unit, Trauma/Spinal Board, Cervical Collar, Haem Glucometer are items that have been included to equip the ambulances for efficient prehospital care. These initiatives enhanced prehospital care by increasing accessibility which hence improved patient outcomes and helped the hospital provide patient centered care.

Through this CSR initiative, Prabhaav Foundation and AGS Health are committed to strengthening ambulance services and enhancing prehospital care for communities in rural Rajasthan. By providing essential medical equipment and support to Sawai Man Singh Hospital's ambulances, we aim to ensure that individuals in need receive timely and effective medical assistance, thereby promoting health and well-being for all, irrespective of geographical location or socio-economic status.



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Our foundation recognizes the critical importance of facilitating access to essential medical equipment for medical professionals, thereby enhancing the quality of care provided to patients under their supervision.

In response to the unprecedented challenges posed by the second wave of Covid-19 in 2021, India faced a dire shortage of medical oxygen, leading to a healthcare crisis of unprecedented proportions. With daily fatalities reaching 3000, the healthcare system teetered on the brink of collapse, exacerbating the need for immediate intervention. Leveraging our partnership with ICICI Lombard, our foundation took proactive measures to address this crisis by donating 400 oxygen concentrators nationwide. These concentrators were distributed strategically to strengthen the healthcare infrastructure of state governments, Primary Health Centers (PHCs), and Community Health Centers (CHCs), thereby ensuring access to life-saving medical interventions for those in need.

Furthermore, in 2023, we extended our support by donating an additional 50 oxygen concentrators to Medulance healthcare (Ambulance services), recognizing the critical role of emergency medical services in providing timely care to patients, particularly in remote and underserved areas.
